

Invitation to Bid for Procurement of One-Year Third Party Courier Services for UCPB Savings Head Office and Branches

- 1) The UCPB Savings Bank Inc. (UCPBS), through the 2025 corporate budget intends to apply the sum of Three Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Pesos (3,750,000,00) inclusive of applicable taxes and charges, including insurance coverage (if applicable) being the Approved Budgel for the Contract (ABC) to payments under the contract for Procurement of One-Year Third Party Courier Services for UCPB Savings Head Office and Branches Bids received in excess of the ABC shall be automatically rejected at bid opening.
- 2) The UCPB Savings Bank Inc. (UCPBS) now invites bids for Procurement of One-Year Third Party Courier Services for UCPB Savings Head Office and Branches.  - Bidding is restricted to Filipino citizens/sole proprietorships, partnerships, or organizations with at least sixty percent (60%) interest or outstanding capital stock belonging to citizens of the Philippines, and to citizens or organizations of a country the laws or regulations of which grant similar rights or privileges to Filipino citizens, pursuant to RA No. 5183.
- Interested Bidders may obtain further information from UCPB Savings Bank Inc. (UCPBS) and inspect the Bidding Documents at the address given below from 8:00am to 5:00pm.
- 5) A complete set of Bidding Ducuments may be acquired by interested Biddiers on August 18, 2025(Monday) to February, 2022(Friday) from the address given below and upon payment of the applicable fee for the Bidding Documents, pursuant to the latest Guidelines issued by the GPPB, in the amount of Php5,000,00.

Preface

This Philippine Bidding Documents (PBD) for the Government of the Philippines (GoP) for the procurement of Goods through (Competitive Bidding, Limited Source Bidding, Competitive Dialogue 1 or Unsolicited Offer with Bid Matching() have been prepared by the GoP for use by all branches, agencies, departments, bureaus, othices, or instrumentalities of the government, including government-owned and/or -controlled corporations (GOCC), government financial institutions (GFI), state universities and colleges (SUC), and local government units (LGU) and autonomous regional government use in projects that are financed in whole or in part by the GOP or any foreign government/foreign or international financing institution³ in accordance with the provisions of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act (RA) No. 12009.

The Bidding Documents shall clearly and adequately define, among others: (a) the objectives, scope, and expected outputs and/or results of the proposed contract: (b) the eligibility requirements of Bidders, such as track record to be determined by the Head of the Producing Entity (HoPE); (c) the expected contract duration, the estimated quantity in the case of procurement of goods, delivery schedule and/or time frame; and (d) the obligations, duties, and/or functions of the winning Bidder.

In order to simplify the preparation of the Bidding Documents for each producement, the PBD groups the provisions that are intended to be used unchanged in Section II Instructions to Bidders (ITB) and in Section IV. General Conditions of Contract (GCC). Data and provisions specific to each producement and contract should be included in Section III. Bid Data Street (BDS): Section V. Special Conditions of Contract (SCC), Section VI. Schedula of Requirements, and Section VII. Technical Specifications. The forms to be used are provided in Section VIII. Philippine Bidding Document. Related Forms.

Produce must be exercised to check the relevance of the provisions of the PBD against the requirements of the specific Goods to be produced. In addition, each section is prepared with notes intended only as information for the Producing Entity or the person drafting the Bridding Documents. They shall not be included in the final documents, except for the notes introducing Section VIII. Philippine Bidding Document. Related Forms where the information is useful for the Bidder. The following general directions should be observed when using the documents.

- a) All the documents listed in the Table of Contents are normally required for the procurement of Goods. However, they should be adapted as necessary to the circumstances of the particular Project.
- b) Specific details, such as the "name of the Produring Entity" and "address for bid submission," should be furnished in the ITB_BDS, and SCC. The final documents should contain neither blank spaces nor options.
- c) This Preface and the footnotes or notes in italics included in the Invitation to Bid, BDS, SCC, Schedule of Requirements, and Specifications are not part of the text of the final document, although they contain instructions that the Procuring Entity should strictly follow. The Bidding Documents should not contain footnotes except Section VIII. Philippine Bidding Document. Related Forms since these provide important guidance to Bidders.

- d) The cover page should be modified as required to identify the Bidding Documents and date of issue.
- The Project title page should be modified as required to identify the Project title and number, name and address of the Propuring Entity
- f) If modifications must be made to the biduing requirements, they can be presented in the BDS. Modifications for specific Project or Contract details should be provided in the SCC as amendments to the Conditions of Contract. For easy reference and completion, clauses from the PBD and SCC shall appear in bold type face or Section II. Instructions to Bidders and Section IV. General Conditions of Contract, respectively.

Definition of Terms

Bid – a signed offer, proposal, or quotation submitted by a supplier manufacturer distributor contractor, consultant, or service provider in response to the requirements of the Producing Entity as stated in the Bidding Documents (IRR, Section Sigl).

Bidder – a supplier, manufacturer, distributor, contractor, consultant, and service provider whether public or private, who submits a Bid in response to the requirements of the Produring Entity as stated in the Bidding Documents. (IRR, Section 5[d]).

Bidding Documents – the documents issued by the Procuring Entity as the basis for Bids, furnishing all information necessary to prospective Bidder to prepare a Bid for the Goods, Intrastructure Projects, and Consulting Services required by the Procuring Entity. (IRR, Section 5[e])

Contract – refers to the agreement entered into between the Procuring Entity and the Supplier or Manufacturer or Distributor or Service Provider for procurement of Goods and Services; Contractor for Procurement of Infrastructure Projects, or Consultant or Consulting Firm for Procurement of Consulting Services; as the case may be, as recorded in the Contract Form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.

Contract Price - the price payable to the Supplier under the Contract for the full and proper performance of its contractual obligations.

Effective Date of the Contract – the date indicated in the contract. However, the Supplier shall extremence performance of its obligations only upon receipt of the Notice to Proceed.

Foreign-funded Producement or Foreign-Assisted Project – refers to the acquisition of Goods. Consulting Services, and the contracting for Infrastructure Projects by the Government of the Philippines which are wholly or parily funded by foreign loans or grants pursuant to a Treaty or International or Executive Agreement

Framework Agreement – is a procurement strategy which shall be in the nature of an option contract between the Procuring Entity and the Bidder that stiputates the terms and conditions to be applied in subsequent contracts for the procurement of Goods. Infrastructure Projects and Consulting Services with a single or multiple contractor, manufacturer, supplier distributor, consultant, and service provider to expand the pool of prospective Bidders, take advantage of economies of scale, minimize the administrative burden of conducting separate procurement activities, and generate time and money savings. (IRR, Section 16.2).

Goods – refer to (i) all items, supplies, and materials, whether in the nature of equipment furniture, stationery, materials for construction, or personal property of any kind, needed in the transaction of public businesses or in the pursuit of any government undertaxing, project or activity; or (ii) general support services which pertain to all types of services except Consulting Services and Infrastructure Projects, such as the repair and maintenance of equipment and furniture as well as trucking, hauling, janiforial, security, and related or analogous services Personnel Services or individual COS or JO engagements do not fall under this definition; (IRR, Section 5in)).

MARB - refers to the award criteria in the procurement of Goods where the considerations for the award of contract are the eligibility of the bidder, the responsiveness of its bid to the fechnical requirements, and the most advantageous bid in reference to the highest rated offer based on the quality component of the bid.

MEARB – refers to the award cotons in the procurement of Goods where the considerations for the sward of contract are the eligibility of the bidder, and the responsiveness of its bid to the technical requirements, and the determination of the most economically advantageous bid in reference to the quality-price ratio allocated to the technical and tinancial components of the bid

Online submission – pertains to the submission of the bid for Goods and the bid envelopes containing the technical and financial components of the bid through electronic means or through the electronic bidding facility of the PhilGEPS.

Project – refers to a specific or dertified procurement devering Goods. Infrastructure Projects or Consulting Services. A Procurement Project shall be described, detailed, and scheduled in the Project Procurement Management. Plan prepared by the agency which shall be consolidated in the procuring entity's Annual Procurement Plan.

Services - means those services ancillary to the supply of the Goods, such as transportation and insurance, and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, and other such obligations of the Supplier covered under the Contract.

Supplier – refers to a citizen, or any corporate body or commercial company duly organized and registered under the laws where it is established, habitually established in business and engaged in the manufacture or sale of the merchandise or performance of the general services covered by its Bid. Supplier as used in these Bidding Documents may likewise refer to a manufacturer, distributor, contractor, or consultant, or service provider.

Verified Report - the report submiffed by the Implementing Unit to the HoPE setting forth its findings as to the existence of grounds or causes for termination and explicitly stating its recommendation for the issuance of a Notice to Terminate.

Notes on the Invitation to Bid

The Invitation to Bid provides information that enables potential Bidders to decide whether to participate in the procurement at hand. The Invitation to Bid shall be:

- a) In line with the principle of transparency and competitiveness and to ensure the widest possible dissemination thereof, all invitations to bid shall be published continuously by the Producing Entity for seven (7) calendar days on the PhilGEPS website, in any conspicuous place reserved for this purpose in the premises of the Producing Entity, and in the website or social media platforms of the Producing Entity, if available, or such other channels as may be authorized by the GPPB and the website prescribed by the foreign government/foreign or international financing institution if applicable.
- For justifiable reasons, a Procuring Entity that cannot publish procurement opportunities on its website, social media platform, or such other channels authorized by the GPPB shall publish its invitation to Bid, at least once, in a newspaper of general nationwide circulation;

Apart from the ossential items listed in the Bidding Decuments, the Invitation to Bid, should also indicate the following.

- a) The availability of the Bidding Documents, which shall commence on the date the Invitation to Bid is first published and continue until the deadline for submission and receipt of hids;
- The place where the Birding Documents may be acquired or the website where it may be downloaded,
- The deadline for the submission and receipt of bids from the last day of publication of the Invitation to Bid.
- d) The procurement strategy/ies (e.g. Life Cycle Assessment and Life Cycle Cost Analysis, Subcontracting, Pooled Procurement) and
- The bid award orderion/oriteria (e.g., the application of a margin of preference in bid evaluation).

The Invitation to Bid should be incorporated in the Bidding Documents. The information contained in the Invitation to Bid must conform to the Bidding Documents, particularly to the relevant information in the BDS.

Notes on the Instructions to Bidders

This Section of the Bidding Documents provides the information necessary for Bidders to prepare responsive bids, in accordance with the requirements of the Producing Entity. It also provides information on bid submission, eligibility check, opening and evaluation of bids, post-qualification and on the award of contract.

This Section contains provisions that shall not be changed or mudified. Any amendment shall be reflected on Section III. Bid Data Sheet which consists of provisions that supplement, amend, or specify in detail, information or requirements included in this Section.

Matters governing performance of the Supplier, payments under the centract, or those affecting the risks linghits, and obligations of the parties under the contract are not normally included in this Section, but rather under Section IV. General Conditions of Contract (GCC), and/or Section IV. Special Conditions of Contract (SCC). If duplication of a subject is inevitable in other sections of the document prepared by the Procuring Entity, prudence must be exercised to avoid contradictions between clauses dealing with the same matter.

- i) "corrupt practice" means an act by which officials in the public or private sectors improperly and unlawfully enrich themselves, others, or induce others to do so, by misusing the position in which they are placed, and includes the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of any such official in the procutement process or in contract execution entering, on behalf of the government, into any contract or transaction manifestly and grossly disadvantageous to the same, whether or not the public officer profited or will profit thereby, and similar acts as provided in RA No. 3019.
- ii) "fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts for purposes of influencing a produrement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of the Produring Entity, which includes collusive practices among Bidders (print to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial, non-competitive levels and to deprive the Produring Entity of the benefits of free and open competition.
- "collusive practices" means a scheme or arrangement between two or more Bidders, with or without the knowledge of the Procuring Entity, designed to establish bid prices at artificial, non-competitive levels
- iv) "noercive practices" means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons, or their property to influence their participation in a procurement process, or affect the execution of a contract;
- v) "obstructive practice" is

- a) deliberately destroying, faisifying, altering or concealing of evidence material to an administrative proceedings or investigation or making false statements to investigators in order to materially impede an administrative proceedings or investigation of the Procuring Entity or any foreign government/foreign or international financing institution relative to allegations of a corrupt, fraudulent, operative or collusive practice and/or threatening, harassing or intimidating any party to prevent the latter from disclosing its knowledge of matters relevant to the administrative proceedings or investigation or from pursuing such proceedings or investigation, or
- b) acts intended to materially impede the exercise of the inspection and audit rights of the Producing Entity or any foreign government/foreign or international financing institution herein.

Undertakes to reject a proposal for award upon *prima facie* determination that the Bidder recommended for award has engaged in any of the prohibited practices mentioned in this Clause for purposes of competing for the contract

- 3.2 Further, the Procuring Entity will seek to impose the maximum civil, administrative, and/or criminal penalties available under applicable laws on individuals and organizations deemed to be involved in any of the practices mentioned in ITB Clause 3.1(a).

- 4.1 All Bidders found to have conflicting interests shall be disqualified to participate in the procurement at hand, without prejudice to the imposition of appropriate administrative, civil, and criminal sanctions. A Bidder may be considered to have conflicting interests with another Bidder in any of the events described in paragraphs (a) through (c) below and a general conflict of interest in any of the circumstances set out in paragraphs (d) and (f) below;
 - A Bridder has controlling shareholders or beneficial owners in common with another Bidder
 - A Bidder receives or has received any direct or indirect subsidy from any other Bidder.
 - A Bidder has the same legally authorized representative as that of another Bidder for purposes of this bid;
 - d) A Bidder has a relationship, directly or through third parties, that puts them in a position to have access to information about or influence on the bid of another Bidder or influence the decisions of the Producing Entity regarding this bidding process. This may include a firm or an organization that lends, or temporarily seconds, its personnel to firms or organizations that are engaged in consulting services for the preparation related to

- producement for or implementation of the project, if the personnel would be involved in any capacity on the same project;
- A Bidder who participated as a consultant in the preparation of the design or technical specifications of the Goods and related services that are the subject of the bid.
- f) A Bidder who lends, or temporarity seconds, its personnel to firms or organizations which are engaged in consulting services for the preparation related to procurement for or implementation of the project, if the personnel would be involved in any capacity on the same project.
- 4.2 All Bidding Documents shall be accompanied by an omnibus sworn statement of the Bidder that it is not related, by consanguinity or affinity up to the third level, to the HoPE, Procurement Agent (if engaged), the head of the Project Management Office (PMO), the End-User or Implementing Unit or any members of the Bids and Awards Committee (BAC). Technical Working Group (TWO), and BAC Secretariat.
- 4.3 The Bidder shall also disclose the ultimate beneficial ownership of an entity. Failure to comply shall be a ground for the automatic disqualification of the bid in consonance with Section 59 of the IRR. For this reason, relation to the aforementioned persons within the third civil degree of consanguinity or affinity shall automatically disqualify the Bidder from participating in the procurement of contracts of the Procuring Entity notwithstanding the act of such persons inhibiting themselves from the procurement process. This Clause shall apply to the following persons and affiliates.
 - In the case of individuals or sole proprietorships, to the Bidders and their spouses;
 - b) In the case of partnerships, to the partnership itself and its partners;
 - In the case of cooperatives, to the cooperative itself and members of the board of directors, general manager or chief executive officer;
 - d) A partnership, joint venture or consortium which is hlacklisted or which has blacklisted member/s or partner/s, as well as a person or entity who is a member of a blacklisted joint venture or consortium, are, likewise not allowed to participate in any government procurement during the period of suspension or blacklisting; and

Notes for Preparing the Technical Specifications

A set of precise and clear specifications is a prerequisite for Bidders to respond realistically and competitively to the requirements of the Producing Entity without qualifying their bids. In the context of Competitive Bidding, the specifications (e.g. production/delivery schedule, manpriver requirements, and after-sales service/parts) must be prepared to permit the widest possible competition and, at the same time present a clear statement of the required standards of workmanship, materials, and performance of the goods and services to be produced. Only if this is done will the objectives of transparency, equity, efficiency, fairness and economy in procurement be realized, responsiveness of bids be ensured, and the subsequent task of bid evaluation and post-qualification facilitated. The specifications should require that all items, materials and accessories to be included or incorporated in the goods be new unused, and of the most recent or current models, and that they include or incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless otherwise provided in the Contract.

Samples of specifications from previous similar procurements are useful in this respect. The use of metric units is uncouraged.
